Grand Knight's Message**Teamwork and Cooperation**

Many years ago, I read an article describing quarterbacks of two different National Football League teams. During practice the week before a game, the home team's defense mimics what the opposing team's defense does. By doing this, the home team's offense sees what the opposing team's defense does and may potentially spot weaknesses that the home team offense can exploit. Essentially the home team's defense helps their offense prepare for the next game.

In the news article, several of Team XXX quarterback's passes were intercepted by his team's defensive players during practice. The quarterback was having difficulty moving his offense down the field. In frustration, the quarterback allegedly yelled at his team's defense to stop working so hard.

The quarterback of Team YYY had a different approach during practice. By studying when the defense was able to intercept his passes, he could see where his mistakes were and learn from them. This would potentially improve how he performed during the game.
