






Our Lady of Fatima Rosary





4th Degree Uniform Raffle

The Assembly will start selling uniform raffle tickets at the door prior to 4th Degree meetings and/or at 4th Degree socials. Tickets will cost \$20 each. 
On Sunday, July 20th, from Noon to 4pm, St. A's Church will host a *Parish Picnic and Car Show!*

one giant leap for mankind"***

It marked the first time that humans landed on the Moon. CDR Neil Armstrong and Lunar Module pilot Buzz Aldrin landed the Lunar Module Eagle on July 20, 1969, at 20:17



Universal Time Coordinated (UTC), and Armstrong became the first person to step onto the Moon's surface six hours and 39 minutes later, on July 21 at 02:56 UTC.

Korean War Armistice

On July 27, 1953, the Korean War officially ended with the signing of an armistice agreement at Panmunjom.

This agreement, signed by the United Nations Command, North Korea, and China, brought an end to active hostilities but did not formally end the war with a peace treaty. The Armistice established a demilitarized zone (DMZ) along the 38th parallel, effectively dividing the Korean peninsula.
