Council News

Council Elections

Each year, the council elects and appoints new men to take on leadership roles within the council. Sometimes these roles are well-defined while other times the role may be expanded based on that individual's talents and/or interest.

Officer Duties

Grand Knight - The Grand Knight (GK) is the council's chief executive officer. He is responsible for setting council goals and ensuring that all officers fulfill their duties in reaching these objectives. He presides over all meetings; appoints program and committee directors as needed; fills officer roles in the event of vacancies; countersigns checks and orders for payment; and oversees the council's degree team. Ideally, the GK should be a junior so that as a senior he can serve as a mentor for the next GK. The GK must complete the Safe Environment training.

Deputy Grand Knight - The Deputy Grand Knight (DPK) serves as the GK's right-hand man and fills in for the GK when he is not present. Some DGKs serve as their council's Program Director. Ultimately, he assists the GK in leading the council and reaching council objectives. In some councils, the DGK role might be used to groom a possible GK candidate for the following year. Finally, the DPK may serve as a liaison between the council and other groups that share similar interest (i.e., Newman Club, pro-life club, etc.).

Chancellor - The Chancellor assists both the GK and DGK in the leading of the council by engaging and strengthening the council's membership. His primary responsibilities include recruiting and retaining members and to this end he should set up events that display the values and principles of the Knights of Columbus. The Chancellor should participate in the council's degree team and should serve on both the Admission and Retention committees.

Treasurer - The Treasurer is responsible for managing the council funds, whether in bank or school accounts. He receives money from the Financial Secretary and deposits funds into council accounts. He is also responsible for paying all council expenses. He also balances and verifies the ledger and keeps the updated budget approved by the council.

Advocate - The Advocate acts as council parliamentarian. He should be knowledgeable in *Robert's Rules of Order and Methods of Conducting a Council Meeting*. He may seek legal assistance from the State Advocate, should issues arise. The Advocate should be able to take on additional responsibilities as the council deems necessary.

Recorder - The Recorder has the responsibility of recording all meetings and events held by the council. He should record minutes, conversations, and other information helpful to the council and prepare them to be distributed to the membership in a timely manner. Additionally, he should help with council event notifications, council meeting reminders, and assist with council social media responsibilities.

Warden - The Warden is responsible for the property owned by the council. He is also in charge of setting up meetings and leads both the inside and outside guards. Many college councils utilize the warden and guards as custodians of the campus ministry property which may include raking leaves, shoveling snow, and assisting with interior maintenance.

Officer Duties (cont.)

Inside/Outside Guards - The Inside/Outside Guards carry out tasks given to them by the GK and follow the Warden's orders. They are responsible for checking membership cards and allowing entrance to meetings. Councils should consider appointing additional Inside/Outside guards, especially among promising freshmen, as this provides early leadership opportunities.

Trustees (3) – Trustees (1 Year, 2 Year, and 3 Year) advise the GK, supervise the council's financial matters, and conduct the semiannual audits. Usually, the immediate past GK will serve as a trustee.

With the forthcoming 2022-2023 Fraternal Year, the following serves as guidance and should behoove the new elected officers to help support and have a successful fraternal year.

Faith in Action Programs

The Faith in Action model is a realization of the changing needs of men in the 21st century. It seeks to balance all KofC key priorities with their -- Faith, Family, Community, and Life -- and present them clearly to our leaders, members, and prospective Knights. The simplicity of Faith in Action is that it fully integrates Building the Domestic Church programs as a foundational part of the model, limits the number of required programs to earn the Columbian Award and, most importantly, allows councils to concentrate on implementing quality faith-filled family programs. Our goal is for men to lead their family in service -- not leave their family for service. The focus of this streamlined program is quality, not quantity.

The four program categories are Faith, Family, Community, and Life and represent our main priorities as an Order. This model by no means seeks to eliminate the need for Knights to serve youth or foster fraternity; rather, it seeks to expand on these in a more holistic way.

FAITH Our goal is to strengthen our men and their families in the faith. When we entered the Order, we were reminded to constantly inform ourselves in the Catholic faith. This formation goes beyond mere facts or religious practice to an authentic connection with a loving God and his son Jesus Christ.

FAMILY Father Michael J. McGivney sought to strengthen the familial bond of father to mother and children to parents. Our family programs are an evolution and response to a society that seeks to weaken the bonds of family. We must make it clear that society should value a family that is faithful to God and each other.

COMMUNITY As Knights of Columbus, we are called to serve our family and our God. Our first principle is Charity, at home with our families or in our communities. This is a critical part of our Knights of Columbus mission.

LIFE The urgency of the threat to a culture of life cannot be misunderstood. Respect for the dignity of life demands a commitment to human rights across a broad spectrum. Both as Knights of Columbus and as followers of Christ, “Catholics must be committed to the defense of life in all its stages and in every condition” (Saint John Paul II, 1995).




