During his general audience Feb. 23, Pope Francis made an appeal for prayer and asked that Ash Wednesday, March 2, be a day of fasting for peace in Ukraine. Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly has also called on Knights to respond with continued prayers and announced on Friday the Supreme Council's commitment to provide immediate aid to Ukrainian refugees.



Knights in Poland are collecting supplies — including medicine, sleeping bags and other necessities — and have begun to deliver them to the Archdiocese of Lviv in western Ukraine.

## Order Pledges, Mobilizes Aid for Ukrainian Refugees

"In this time of intense danger, know that your brother Knights of Columbus around the world are praying for you, your families and all the people of Ukraine," he said. - Private businesses and local governments that want to require masks for their employees, customers or residents




### \*Not Required:


