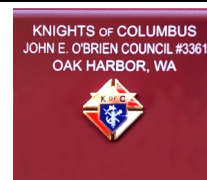

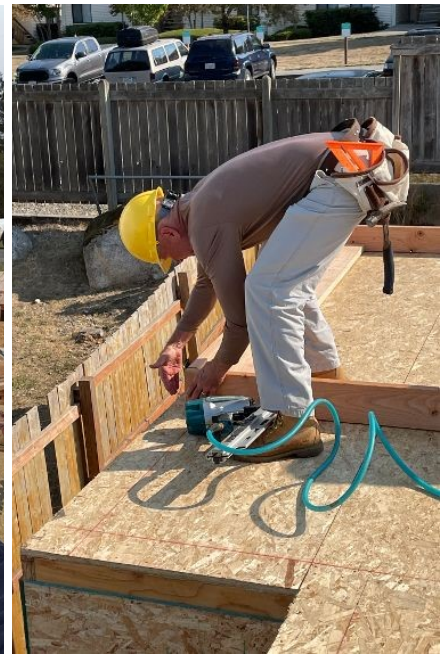

## ***Knight of the Month***

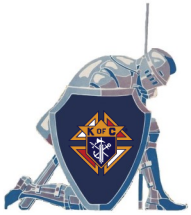

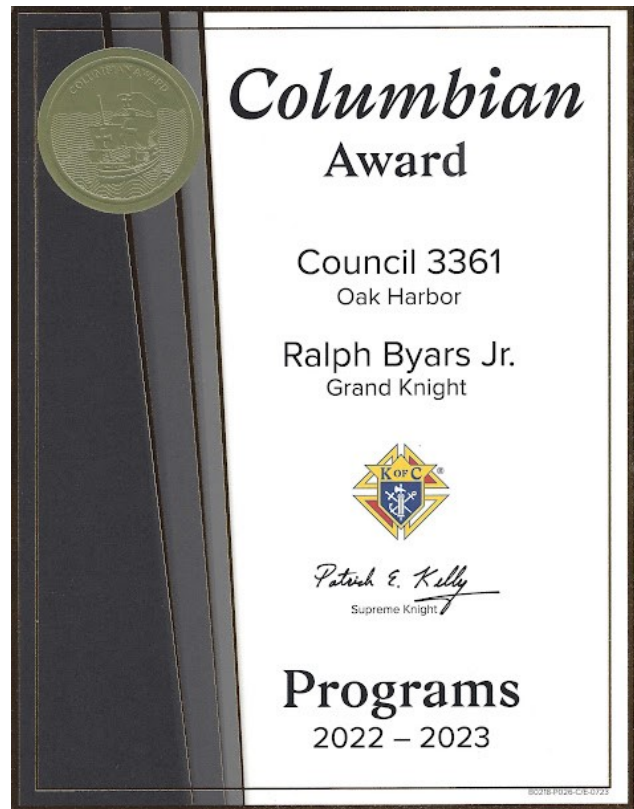

From the Faithful Navigator

Let me start with some clarification about the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree uniform.

Those that are 70 years or older will not be required to purchase the new uniform. You will still be an active member of the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree. For our younger 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Knights, you are required to purchase a new uniform. You made an obligation to support and actively participate in 4<sup>th</sup> Degree.

The 4<sup>th</sup> Degree has a \$100 incentive program for members purchasing the new uniform. Once a member has purchased the new uniform, the member will provide a copy of the receipt to the Faithful Navigator at a 4<sup>th</sup> Degree meeting. The Faithful Navigator in turn gives the receipt to the Faithful Comptroller who writes a \$100 payment voucher. This voucher is then given to the Faithful Purser who writes a check to give to the member.

We need our younger Sir Knights and Brother Knights to step up. If you have not been active in the 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> Degree programs, I'm asking you to actively support these programs. I've spoken with the District Deputy, Ralph Byars, and we in the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Program are at a tipping point. If our membership or participation doesn't increase, we will be forced to suspend the Assembly! I don't want to see this happen.

Please consider returning to our 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Program. Let's keep this degree alive and well for our future Sir Knights.

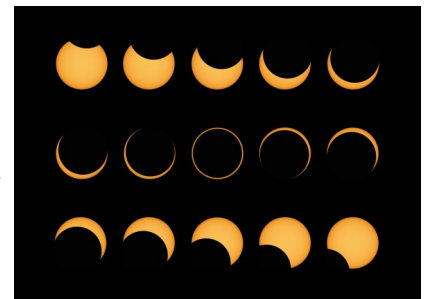

## **Annular Solar Eclipse**

On the morning of October 14<sup>th</sup>, an annular (or rare ring-shaped) solar eclipse will darken the skies across the United States. It is the first annular solar eclipse since May 2012. The Sun is never completely blocked by the Moon during an annular solar eclipse. Therefore, during an annular eclipse, it is never safe to look directly at the Sun without specialized eye protection designed for solar viewing.



**WARNING!! Do NOT look at the Sun through a camera lens, telescope, binoculars, or any other optical device while wearing eclipse glasses or using a handheld solar viewer -- the concentrated solar rays will burn through the filter and cause serious eye injury.**

When watching an annular solar eclipse directly with your eyes, you must always look through safe solar viewing glasses ("eclipse glasses") or a safe handheld solar viewer. Eclipse glasses are **NOT** regular sunglasses; regular sunglasses, no matter how dark, are not safe for viewing the Sun. [Safe solar viewers](#) are thousands of times darker and ought to comply with the [ISO 12312-2](#) international standard. NASA does not approve of any brand of solar viewers.
