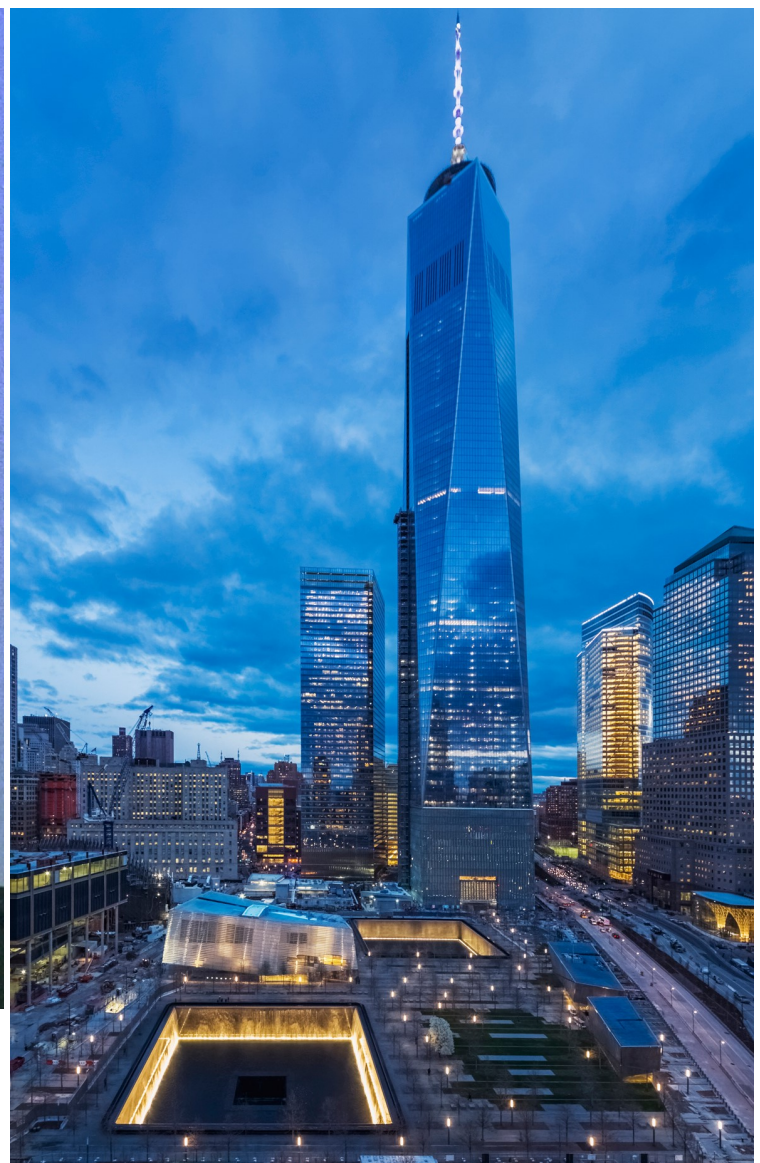

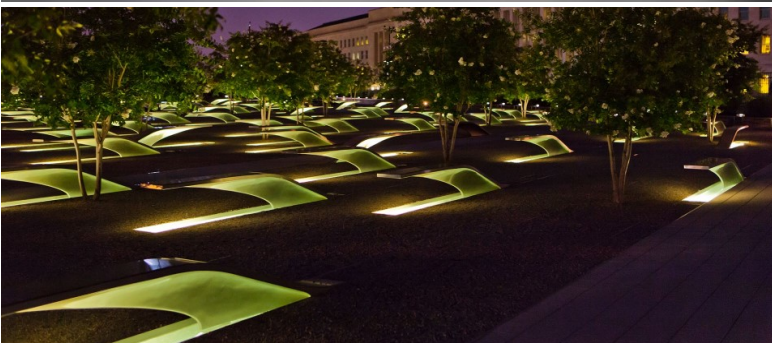

*A common field one day. A field of honor forever.*

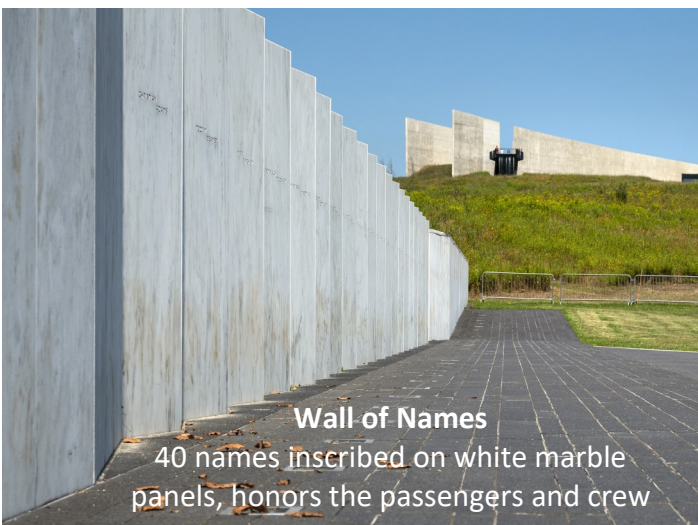


This 17 ton boulder marks the impact area and also serves as their final resting place. These 40 passengers and crew gave their lives to save countless others.

From the Faithful Navigator,

Let me start with some clarification about the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree uniform.

Those that are 70 years or older will not be required to purchase the new uniform. You will still be an active member of the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree. For our younger 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Knights, you are required to purchase a new uniform. You made an obligation to support and actively participate in 4<sup>th</sup> Degree.

The 4<sup>th</sup> Degree has a \$100 incentive program for members purchasing the new uniform. Once a member has purchased the new uniform, the member will provide a copy of the receipt to the Faithful Navigator at a 4<sup>th</sup> Degree meeting. The Faithful Navigator in turn gives the receipt to the Faithful Comptroller who writes a \$100 payment voucher. This voucher is then given to the Faithful Purser who writes a check to give to the member.

We need our younger Sir Knights and Brother Knights to step up. If you have not been active in the 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> Degree programs, I'm asking you to actively support these programs. I've spoken with the District Deputy, Ralph Byars, and we in the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Program are at a tipping point. If our membership or participation doesn't increase, we will be forced to suspend the Assembly! I don't want to see this happen.

Please consider returning to our 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Program. Let's keep this degree alive and well for our future Sir Knights.





## Uniform Package



- Navy blue blazer festooned with 4<sup>th</sup> Degree crest and emblem buttons
- Dark gray trousers
- Embordered necktie
- Black beret with 4<sup>th</sup> Degree metal badge

**NOT INCLUDED:** Plain white dress shirt w/button cuff (no French cuffs or button down collared shirts)

**NOT INCLUDED:** Black socks, plain black shoes, official 4<sup>th</sup> Degree lapel pin, incumbent medal of office, past and former miniatures (worn above left pocket), sword, baldrick, and gloves.

The garments of the official dress are produced in Italy. The fabric used for both blazers and pants is woven in Italy specifically for the KofC from a high quality super 130 wool, which denotes wool being new and pure and the numbers correspond to the thickness of the wool fibers. Best for people who do not use their suit as often or will be wearing during summer months. This fabric is perfect who care more about comfort, durability and warmth.

The blazer buttons are made in Italy. The KofC blazer patches are completely hand embroidered. The tie is Italian silk, but made in the USA.

The new uniform is worn as you would a business suit.

The beret is worn with the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree pin placed directly above left eye w/ right side of beret folding down towards right ear.

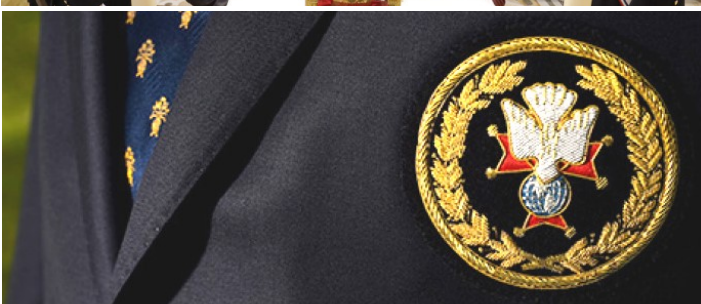
**Size Guidelines.** If you are:

- 5'5" - 5'8" order a Short jacket and trousers
- 5'9" - 6' order a Regular jacket and trousers
- 6'1" - 6'4" order a Tall jacket and trousers
- 6'5" - 6'8" order an Extra Tall (XT) jacket and trousers

Once you receive the uniform package, trousers will need to be hemmed.

Basic Official Uniform costs \$449.00, but adding Options like a U.S. Service Baldric (\$28.50), Leather Oxford Dress Shoes (\$98), White Gloves (\$6), Beret Patch (\$2.50) for FN & PFNs will certainly add to the overall cost.





## PURPOSE of the 4<sup>th</sup> DEGREE COLOR CORPS

When knighthood was in flower, Knights carried the sword to defend their God, their Church, their country and their fellow man according to the code of chivalry.

Sir Knights wear regalia and carry the sword to honor Christ and His apostles, especially on religious and civic occasions. Hence, the primary purpose of the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree is to encourage active Catholic citizenship and foster the spirit of patriotism in members and the community at large.

Color Corps members exemplify all principles of the Order:

- **Charity** - by the gift of their time and energies necessary to practice, perfect and perform the ceremonials and sword drill;
- **Unity** -by the united efforts of Sir Knights to practice and perfect a coordinated drill for the good of the Church and the Order;
- **Fraternity** - by expressing an “Esprit de Corps,” sharing a common desire for drill excellence and camaraderie; and
- **Patriotism** - by performing precision drill as a salute to God and country, visually exhibiting a love for both.

The public appearance of 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Knights, as a Color Corps, at religious and civic functions is an important activity of each assembly. Their uniforms add dignity and the pride of the Church and country to any event. By these public demonstrations, their loyalties bring credit to themselves and to the Knights of Columbus.
